

Letter from the Chairman

Welcome to the San Angelo Health Foundation's 2017 Annual Report. The mission of the Foundation is "to enhance the quality of life for the people of the San Angelo area". Since inception the Foundation has awarded nearly \$50 million to 204 organizations and 680 worthy projects. A healthy San Angelo is a community with a wide range of cultural, educational, health care, transportation, housing and public services. Access and affordability of services provides all citizens an opportunity to achieve their highest level of independence and contribution to the community. San Angelo is a vibrant community that is rich in nonprofit organizations that assist us in reaching our mission.

We granted \$2 million to 34 deserving projects in 2017. Funded program areas include arts and humanities, human services, youth development, education, public saftey, housing and health care. Some highlights include:



- The first Texas Mission of Mercy event in San Angelo an event offering free dental services performed by volunteer dentists
- Galilee Community Development Center's Jeremiah Project offering transitional housing to those on the brink of homelessness
- West Texas Counseling & Guidance recruiting and retaining qualified staff to address the increasing mental health needs of our community
- Howard College Creating a construction trades program to combat an increasing need for tradesmen
- Angelo State University a brand new state of the art 3D Anatomy lab located in the newly constructed College of Health and Human Services for students in the health sciences

The board will continue to identify gaps in services, new projects, capacity building initiatives and community efforts to improve the quality of life in the Concho Valley. The future of the Foundation is optimistic!

In closing, I would like to express my thanks and gratitude to the Foundation Trustees. The last four years have been swift and very productive. Thank you, Trustees, for your time and dedication to the Foundation.

Texas Mission of Mercy Event

The first San Angelo Texas Mission of Mercy was a very successful event for the Texas Dental Association Smiles Foundation. The two day event entailed hundreds of volunteers performing free dental services. This event treated 518 patients and provided over \$484,000 of free dental services.



Patients began lining up at five in the morning to participate. The event was completely staffed by volunteer dentists, hygienists, dental students and other volunteers. The volunteers were tasked with setting

up all the mobile dental equipment provided by the Texas Dental Association Smiles Foundation. The volunteers also raised awareness of the event, prescreened patients and assisted in any capacity needed.

Angelo State University

The San Angelo Health Foundation encourages our local educational institutions to improve student learning and academic achievement. Angelo State University keeps a watchful eye on areas to improve their curriculum.



One recent improvement is the addition of a 3D anatomy lab using BodyViz software. The 3D lab gives students in anatomy class realistic imagery using actual patient images. Our partnership with Angelo State University allowed us to provide the hardware to make this lab accessible to students.



Grant Application Information

Applicant organizations must have an exemption from the Internal Revenue Service indicating that it is an organization described in Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and is treated as other than a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code. Public institutions may also qualify if the grant requested is to be used exclusively for public purposes.

Organizations meeting the above guidelines may submit grant proposals that address an identifiable current need, demand or problem in the community that is defined and documented by the applicant organization. Applications are accepted on a continuing basis.

- life insurance



San Angelo Health Foundation, created from the proceeds from the sale of Angelo Community Hospital in 1995, became the recipient of the assets of the Myrtle Williams' estate. Consistent with her wishes, funds from the Myrtle Williams Estate have been granted by San Angelo Health Foundation to benefit healthcare facilities in the San Angelo area. Grant commitments over \$5 million have been made possible through the generous gift of Myrtle Williams in honor of her parents, William Harden Williams and Mary Eveline Holmes Williams. The legacy of Miss Myrtle Williams continues and so do the benefits of her generosity and foresight to increase the quality and breadth of health care for the citizens of the San Angelo area.



Dunbar Library

The North by Northwest Lions club restored the Dunbar Library as a historic site. The library was built in the 1930s during the period of segregation to be used by the African American community in San Angelo. Their intent is to preserve African American literature, children's resources for a one-stop research site and create a functioning library with historical books and documents.



The restoration is complete and the newly restored library is benefitting from a Volunteer in Service to America (VISTA). The library is manned by a VISTA volunteer. The library holds some rare collections, has books available to check out and can provide special tours upon appointment.
